He can't wait for *Furry Monsters 2*. ■

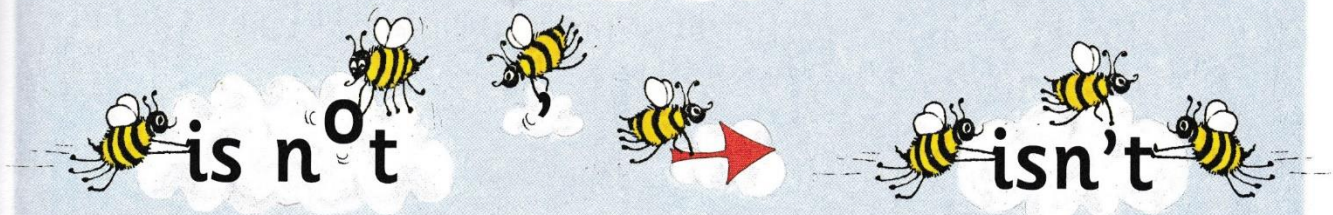

Contractions



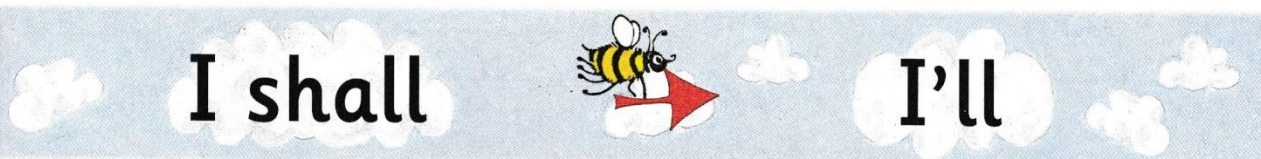

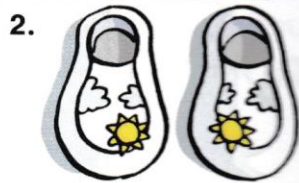
