Wassily Kadinsky: Squares and Concentric Circles

Show your child the above painting. Tell them that it was painted by a famous Russian artist called Wassily Kadinsky. Kadinsky is thought to be the first painter who stopped painting 'things' and painted using just colours and shapes as a means of expressing his feelings.

Ask your child the questions below based on the painting:

- 1. What do you see when you look at this painting?
- 2. How has the painting been made?
- 3. What kind of colours does Kandinsky use?
- 4. How would you describe these colours?
- 5. What shapes can you see?
- 6. What kind of lines can you see?
- 7. How do you think Kandinsky was feeling when he painted this?
- 8. How does the painting make you feel?
- 9. Do you like it? Why?

Try and recreate Kadinsky's painting. Choose your own colours. Divide your page into squares to begin (4 to 6 squares is plenty). If you don't have paint you could use your Twistables.
