



Precipitation: The water falls down to the land as rain, sleet, snow or hail.




Collection: The water collects in streams, rivers, lakes and the sea.

6. Anansi held the gourd close to his body with two of his legs. He tried to climb the tree, but the gourd full of wisdom kept getting in the way and he could not climb.


